#### 2022-23 Caregiver Workforce Crisis Report

The Wisconsin Personal Services Association (WPSA) is the only statewide association dedicated to personal care agencies, which provide in-home caregiving services. WPSA heard from 80 personal care agencies, representing nearly every county in the state, in Fall of 2022 that the direct care workforce crisis continues to threaten both the viability of the state's long-term care provider network and, more importantly, the safety of older adults and people with disabilities.

## What the Personal Care Rate Covers

From the \$23.44/hour rate, agencies must pay:

- -Personal Care Worker Wages
- -Workers Comp, FICA Unemployment
- -Benefits
- -Travel Pay and Other Pay Differentials
- -Other staff, such as nurses, supervisors, schedulers
- -Supplies
- -EVV mandate
- -Training
- -Indirect costs like billing, IT, clerical
